"When shall we have a new Francis? +Seby Mascarenhas sfx

On Easter Sunday I randomly tuned to the YouTube live coverage of the Easter service in Rome. Coincidence, Telepathy, Providence? The Pope was about to say his last words in public – the Urbi et Orbi Blessing. It was not announced earlier. I felt blessed to catch it live, *his last words in public*. It was then announced that he would drive among



the people in his Popemobile. You could see he was struggling. This was the act of man of deep faith who knew he was going to his heavenly reward, not a man who would want to live another few days on earth in the hospital. He was a man who was saying with His Lord: *It is accomplished, into your hands I commend my Spirit.* What a witness to the basic foundation of our faith - the resurrection with the Lord.

I did not think that he would die so soon, but I did think that this was his final appearance. I was privileged to tune in live.

My personal encounter with the Pope goes back to October 22, 2013. I have never shared this, except personally to a few people. I share my seminal encounter with him on the day he

will be buried, in detail! To those who might find this " *bragging*", my apologies in advance!

Somehow, although I was studying in Europe at the time, I did not feel the urge to meet St John Paul II or Pope Benedict. However Pope Francis lit up the world. I told my brother, Bishop Theodore, who was serving for the Vatican at the time, to see if I could attend the daily mass of the Pope in Santa Marta. He managed to get me on the list for the Mass of October 22, 2013 through the kind grace of Cardinal Oswald Gracias.

We walked the dark alleys from the Jesuit Curia, where I had put up for the night, to *Domus Sanctae Marthae*, something like a scene in *Da Vinci Code* by Dan Brown.

I was shocked at the absolutely relaxed security as we went in. I had a cloth bag with my alb, a Warli-art-painted bag and a magazine. No one checked what was in my bag. They only asked me for my name; they did not bother to ask

> for any identification. I was thrilled and shocked. But that was perhaps ordered by Francis, the approachable Pope. He trusted us!

We were assigned the first row in the pews. There were two bishops (one from India, I do not remember from where) some priests, some nuns and about 40 faithful. As the Pope entered, my impression was that of an elderly man. But when he preached a three point homily, I was touched, even with my primitive Italian. Clear, precise and brief, true to what he tells us now!

He sat in prayer for about five minutes and then stood up to greet us all. We were made to stand in line, hierarchically. When my turn came he spontaneously came forward and put his hands on



my shoulders. I was stunned. I had rehearsed the words I would say to him. I forgot everything and just blurted out in German: Would you want me to speak in German or English. I forgot to say YOUR HOLINESS! I knew he had studied in Germany and would prefer German. He gently said to me, in German: Pray

for me. Speak in German please, but slowly! I then spoke to him about India and my missionary congregation, the Society of Pilar. I told him that everyone loves what he was doing.

I then presented a bag, painted by minor girls (rescued from the red light milieu) who were being rehabilitated by the Vedruna sisters in Waliv, Vasai, just opposite the Pilar Provincialate. On my way to the airport, I had picked these bags from from Srs. Asha ccv and Ila ccv who were there at the time. He listened carefully and nodded with a smile. This was precisely his mission.

I finally got my magazine out; before I could present it to him the priest behind him nodded gently to me. I guess I had taken my time. So I just left the magazine in the bag, handed it over and walked away.

The magazine is a story in itself. In February 2013, at the request of Fr. Romualdo sfx, I had written a play on St Francis of Assisi for our college going scholastics in Waliv, Vasai. It was entitled, *"When shall we have a new Francis!"*. As the scholastics and I sat in front of the TV for about twenty minutes, after white smoke had fluttered in the Roman sky on March 13, 2013, to see who the new Pope would be, one of the scholastics joked: *I think he will be a Francis*! After all we had asked for a new Francis! We had goose bumps when it was FRANCIS indeed ! My magazine had the play on Francis in it!

At the end, I kissed his ring and asked him to bless me. He said, pray for me.

When Bp. Theodore and Fr Agnelo Pinheiro sj met me at the Jesuit Curia, I did not relate much as I was overwhelmed. I did not even realise what had happened.

A few days later Bp. Theodore rang me up from the Vatican Press Office to say that I had beautiful photos, absolutely unique, one of a kind. I was stunned to see them. I then realised what had really happened. It was one of those experiences that determine your life. His reaching out, his patient listening and his personal touch towards me is the hallmark that makes his papacy so attractive.

Ten years later, I met Pope Francis again when I went to Rome in September 2023 for the training of baby Bishops. I had been appointed Bishop of Baroda by him.

It was a memorable occasion but in another way. As my turn came to meet the Pope and I knelt before him, incredibly, *the camera broke down*. I was exasperated. Being a true Social Media man, the photo was important above all. The photographer ran and brought another camera. But it was too late. My time was up! I got a rather blurred photo in black and white as I was preparing to hand over a memento of Ven. Agnelo to the Pope! It is always providence. Perhaps I *was* warned not to *brag*!

Francis proclaimed GOOD NEWS. He read the signs of the times and proclaimed **JOY** (*Evangelii Gaudium*) and **HOPE** (*Spes non confundit*) to a despondent, egoistic and indifferent atmosphere, not just in world politics, but also within the Church. He spoke about clericalism in the Church as often as as he spoke against capitalism and greed. This did not endear



him to the establishment, within the Church or in the world around. He was an oasis of compassion in the desert of narcissism in the world today.

His antidote was simple: *Listen to the Spirit within you; Even more, listen to <u>every</u> person as the Spirit speaks to each person as well. Only then can we genuinely LIVE JESUS in humility and compassion. This will attract people to Jesus*

He did that. He lived the Gospel in all its radicality. He brought God down to us., as the woman said to Cardinal Dolan.

I wish it most for me, our clergy and our religious as the Pope trusted us to bring in a compassionate, listening, synodal leadership. May His example guide us.

Afterwards, he spoke to everyone: "You are the pulse of your communities. Bring them not only structure, but Spirit. The Gospel was never meant to stay behind stone walls." He then expressed His Joy in meeting each delegate personally and gifted each one of us The holy Rosary saying (softly): "Courage, my daughter. Christ and His mother walks with you."

As we bid farewell to Pope Francis, let us remember his call to serve the marginalized, his advocacy for peace, and his embodiment of Christ's love. May his example inspire us to live lives of compassion and humility. May the soul of our Holy father Pope Francis Rest in Peace.....Amen.

Jesus at the Periphery, Pastoal Approaches to the Peripiery, Migrants as a Prime Group at the Periphery

REACHING OUT TO CATHOLICS ON THE PERIPHERY

Recollection Talk for Gathering of Priests and Religious on the occasion of Chrism Mass

It was great joy to see over 100 clergy and over 100 religious participate in the Chrism Mass on April 11m 2025 in the Rosary Cathedral. Before the Mass, we gathered in the Auditorium of the Rosary School for a reflection on Reaching out to Catholics on the Periphery. Fr. Isaac sdb gave us Biblical perspectives and practical hints to reach out like Jesus to the peripheries. We are reproducing his talk in this issue. Fr. Ishwan Gamit sj presented how he concretely reaches out to the challenges in his remote parish. Sr. Maggie Allessu dhm, Director of the Migrant Commission of the Diocese took up the issue of migrants as a group on the periphery and gave practical hints to how we would reach out to them in the next pastoral year, especially with a detailed survey so that we could network among parishes. Silver and Golden Jubilarians were also felicitated at the Chrism Mass.

Jesus' ministry was marked by a radical inclusion of those marginalized by society—sinners, tax collectors, the sick, the poor, Gentiles, and women. He consistently reached beyond religious and social barriers to offer grace, healing, and dignity to those on the fringes.

Here are key biblical examples and their implications for the Church today:

1. JESUS WELCOMED SINNERS AND OUTCASTS

Biblical Example:

- \emptyset Jesus ate with tax collectors and sinners (Matthew 9:10-13),
- Ø defended the woman caught in adultery (John 8:1-11),
- Ø and forgave the sinful woman who anointed His feet (Luke 7:36-50).

Practical Application:

The Church must move beyond judgment and create spaces where people burdened by guilt, addiction, or past mistakes can encounter Christ's mercy. Instead of shunning those with "unacceptable" pasts, we should follow Jesus' example of compassionate engagement.

2. JESUS HEALED THE SICK AND DISABLED Biblical Example:

- Ø Jesus touched and healed lepers (Luke 5:12-13),
- Ø restored sight to blind beggars (Mark 10:46-52),
- Ø and healed the woman with the bleeding issue (Mark 5:25-34) – <u>all of whom were socially and</u> <u>religiously ostracized.</u>

Practical Application:

The Church should actively care for the sick, disabled, and mentally ill, ensuring they are not neglected or treated as burdens. Hospitals, counseling ministries, and disabilityinclusive worship are modern ways to embody Christ's healing love.

3. JESUS ELEVATED WOMEN IN A PATRIARCHAL SOCIETY Biblical Example:

- Ø Jesus spoke openly with the Samaritan woman (John 4:1-42),
- Ø defended Mary's right to learn at His feet (Luke 10:38-42),
- Ø and appeared first to women after His resurrection (Matthew 28:1-10) - <u>countercultural acts in a society</u> <u>that marginalized women.</u>

Practical Application:

The Church must challenge gender-based discrimination, empower women in leadership, and protect women from

abuse and exploitation, affirming their God-given dignity. **4. JESUS CROSSED ETHNIC AND RELIGIOUS BARRIERS Biblical Example:**

- Ø Jesus praised the faith of a Roman centurion (Matthew 8:5-13)
- $\ensuremath{\ensuremath{\mathcal{O}}}$ and healed the daughter of a Syrophoenician



woman (Mark 7:24-30), <u>- showing that God's grace</u> extends beyond Israel.

Practical Application:

The Church must actively oppose racism, welcome immigrants and refugees, and build bridges with people of different cultures, just as Jesus did.

5. JESUS CARED FOR THE POOR AND OPPRESSED

Biblical Example:

- Ø Jesus proclaimed good news to the poor (Luke 4:18),
- Ø blessed the meek (Matthew 5:5),
- Ø and warned the rich about neglecting Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31)

Practical Application:

The Church must advocate for economic justice, support food banks, job training, and affordable housing, and challenge systems that perpetuate poverty.

CONCLUSION: The Church's Call to the Margins Today

Jesus' ministry was not confined to the religious elite but intentionally extended to those pushed aside by society. Today, the Church must:

- v **Go out -** (like the Good Shepherd in Luke 15:4-6) rather than wait for the marginalized to come to us.
- v **Listen** to the struggles of the oppressed rather than assume we have all the answers.
- v **Advocate** for systemic change where injustice exists.
- v **Love unconditionally-** even when it disrupts our comfort.

As Pope Francis has emphasized, we must be a "Church that goes forth," especially to the "existential peripheries." Only then will we truly follow in the footsteps of Christ.

"The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor... to set the oppressed free." (Luke 4:18)*

- 3. **Personal Invitations:** Encourage active parishioners to invite friends/family back many leave because no one noticed they were gone.
- 4. **Digital Outreach:** Use social media, podcasts, or YouTube homilies to engage those who won't step into a church yet.

Biblical Models:

The Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32) — The father waits and welcomes without condemnation.

2. WELCOMING YOUTH & YOUNG ADULTS

Who They Are: Many young Catholics feel the Church is irrelevant or unwelcoming. How to Reach Them:



PRACTICAL WAYS THE PARISH CAN REACH OUT TO CATHOLICS ON THE PERIPHERY

A vibrant parish must intentionally seek out those who feel disconnected — whether due to cultural shifts, personal struggles, or systemic neglect. Here are practical ways to minister to marginalized Catholics in a parish setting:

1. REACHING INACTIVE OR DISENGAGED CATHOLICS

Who They Are: Catholics who no longer attend Mass, feel disillusioned, or have drifted away due to life circumstances.

How to Reach Them:

- 1. **Home Visits & Listening Sessions:** Train parishioners to visit lapsed Catholics, not to scold but to listen and invite.
- 2. **"Come and See" Events:** Host informal gatherings (e.g., Alpha, testimony nights) where people can explore faith without pressure.

Youth & Young Adult Mentorship: Pair them with older, faith-filled mentors.

- 1. *Authentic Community*: Offer small groups, sports ministries, or service projects rather than just lectures.
- 2. *Address Their Struggles*: Host discussions on mental health, career discernment, and relationships from a Catholic perspective.
- 3. *Contemporary Worship Nights:* Incorporate praise music, adoration with testimonies, and open Q&A with priests.

Biblical Model: Jesus and the Rich Young Man (Mark 10:17-22) — He meets the young man where he is but challenges him to go deeper.

3. SUPPORTING MARRIAGES OF DISPARITY OF CULT (INTERFAITH COUPLES)

Who They Are: Couples where one spouse is Catholic and

the other is not, often feeling isolated in the Church. How to Reach Them:

- 1. Specialized Marriage Prep & Support Groups: Offer resources for interfaith couples to navigate faith differences.
- 2. Inclusive Parish Events: Ensure parish activities (e.g., family picnics, feast days) are welcoming to non-Catholic spouses.
- 3. Testimonies from Similar Couples: Share stories of how interfaith marriages can thrive while keeping the Catholic faith alive.
- 4. Priest Availability: Encourage priests to meet personally with such couples to address their concerns.

Biblical Model: St. Paul's advice on mixed marriages



(1 Corinthians 7:12-14) — The faith of one can sanctify the household.

4. MINISTERING TO MIGRANTS & REFUGEES

Who They Are: Immigrants, migrant workers, and refugees who may feel like outsiders in the parish. How to Reach Them:*

- 1. Multilingual Masses & Sacraments: Offer Masses in their language and provide translators for confessions.
- 2. Cultural Celebrations: Host feast days from their home countries (e.g., Our Lady of Guadalupe for Mexicans, Simbang Gabi for Filipinos).
- 3. Legal & Social Support: Partner with Catholic Charities to assist with housing, jobs, and immigration paperwork.
- 4. Intentional Hospitality: Train parishioners to welcome newcomers personally, not just with handshakes but with real friendship.

Biblical Model: Jesus as a refugee in Egypt (Matthew 2:13-15) — He identifies with the displaced.

5. ENGAGING DIVORCED & REMARRIED CATHOLICS

Who They Are: Many feel unwelcome or assume they can't receive sacraments.

How to Reach Them:

- 1. Clear Teaching with Mercy: Offer workshops on annulments, emphasizing that the Church wants to help, not exclude.
- Support Groups: Create safe spaces for divorced/separated Catholics to share struggles and find healing.
 - 3. Priest Availability: Ensure priests are approachable for pastoral guidance (many avoid Church out of shame).

Biblical Model: Jesus and the Samaritan Woman (John 4:1-26) — He offers her living water despite her broken past.

6. CARING FOR THE ELDERLY & HOMEBOUND

Who They Are: Seniors who can no longer attend Mass, often feeling forgotten.

How to Reach Them:

- 1. Regular Home Visits & Communion Calls: Train Eucharistic ministers to visit the homebound weekly.
- 2. Parish "Adopt-a-Grandparent" Program: Connect youth with elderly parishioners for mutual enrichment.
- 3. Technology Assistance: Help them access livestreamed Masses or set up video calls with family.

Biblical Model: Jesus healing the sick and elderly (Luke 8:40-56, John 9:1-7) – He touches those society ignores.

7. SUPPORTING THOSE WITH SAME-SEX ATTRACTION & GENDER IDENTITY STRUGGLES Who They Are: Many LGBTQ+ Catholics feel rejected or unwelcome.

How to Reach Them:

- Ministries of Listening & Accompaniment: Follow the *"Courage"* or *"Eden Invitation"* model – pastoral care without compromising teaching.
- 2. Clear but Compassionate Preaching: Address topics with charity, avoiding both harshness and ambiguity.
- 3. Personal Friendship: Many just need a parish where they are treated with dignity, not as "issues."

Biblical Model: The Man Born Blind (John 9:1-41) - He is seen and loved in his suffering.

Jesus at the Periphery, Pastoal Approaches to the Peripiery, Migrants as a Prime Group at the Periphery

Why This Passage Resonates:

1. He Is Seen and Loved in His Suffering

- The disciples ask, "Who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" (John 9:2).

- Parallel Today: Many with SSA or gender dysphoria are wrongly assumed to be "sinful by nature" or products of a "broken home." Jesus rejects this false premise -"Neither the man where he is and guides him deeper - without forcing instant orthodoxy.

Practical Parish Applications

1. Reject Reductive Labels

- Avoid framing SSA/gender struggles as only "disordered" or "inherently sinful." Like the blind man, the person is a



this man nor his parents sinned" (v. 3). Instead, He focuses on God's power to bring light through the struggle.

2. Jesus Touches Him Personally

- Jesus spits on the ground, makes mud, and anoints the man's eyes (v. 6).

- Parallel Today: People with SSA/gender struggles often feel like theological abstractions. Jesus engages personally and physically, showing that pastoral care requires dignity, presence, and tangible love - not just debates.

3. He Faces Rejection from Religious Leaders

- After healing, the man is interrogated, dismissed, and cast out by the Pharisees (vv. 24-34).

- Parallel Today: Many with SSA/gender conflicts feel ostracized by religious communities - judged as "unfit" for full participation. Jesus later finds the outcast man and affirms him (v. 35-38), modeling how the Church must seek those pushed to the margins.

4. Transformation, Not Immediate Perfection

- The man's understanding of Jesus grows gradually:
 - o First, he calls Jesus "a prophet" (v. 17).
 - o Then, "a man from God" (v. 33).
 - o Finally, he worships Him as "Lord" (v. 38).

- Parallel Today: Pastoral care requires patience. People may need time to reconcile faith and identity. Jesus meets

beloved child of God before any diagnosis.

2. Prioritize Accompaniment Over Debate

- Follow Jesus' method: act first (heal), explain later (theology). Serve before demanding conformity.

3. Create Safe Spaces for Questions

- Many, like the healed man, face hostile interrogation (John 9:24-34). The parish should be a place where doubts are heard without fear of expulsion.

4. Protect from Religious Trauma

- Jesus sought out the man after he was cast out (v. 35). The Church must actively reach out to those wounded by harsh religiosity.

5. Celebrate Progress, Not Just Perfection

- The man's faith develops in stages. Parish ministries should walk with people as they grow - not demand immediate, flawless adherence.

CONCLUSION

A PARISH THAT GOES TO THE MARGINS

Pope Francis reminds us: "The Church must be a field hospital." This means:

Going out (not waiting for people to come).

Listening first (not leading with demands).

Meeting practical needs (not just spiritual ones).

Building bridges, not walls.

A parish that does this will not just grow in numbers — it will radiate the love of Christ. "I have come not to call the righteous, but sinners." (Mark 2:17)


